IIT Indore faculty member creates Guinness World Record

An adjunct faculty with Indian Institute of Technology Indore now holds a world record.

Chemical engineering Professor Dr Vilas Pol set the record for the fastest time to arrange all elements of the periodic table Wednesday morning, reported a website.

The record has never

been attempted before. Guinness World Record gave Pol three attempts to



Since this was a new record attempt, Vilas was given 10

minutes. He accomplished it in 8 minutes and 36 seconds. Vilas hopes setting the record will inspire future students to pursue science. "I hope they will remember it because the period table is a mother of science and technology. If you know it well, you can excel at science and deal with very good technologies," Pol was quoted as saying by the website.

It took Pol all three attempts to successfully complete the table, but it was also his fastest recorded time.
