

'Our education system needs massive reform'

Indore: Oxford scholar and author Ashish Jaiswal stressed that the country's education system and curriculum needs a massive reform.

"It's absolutely ok if you fail at IIT or IIM because today you have enormous resources available to pace your own journey. Observe the world, reflect on it and create your own path," said Jaiswal.

Universities are not the only fort holding knowledge because the decades old education system is crumbling, emphasized Jaiswal.

"We need to prepare ourselves for an unpredictable future because no expert can tell what kind of jobs will be available after over a decade," the author said while sharing his views with students of Indian Institute of Technology at TEDx held on Sunday.

The author of international bestsellers - 'Fluid', 'True Dummy' and 'How to reform a business school' stressed that technology has unlocked knowledge and in a decade, more students will do enterprises than opting for jobs.

nasia, Dr Prasun Chatterjee, specialist and assistant professor of Geriatrics Department, AIIMS New Delhi said, "Every person in his sixties should write a living medical will so that a person lives a life of dignity and not on mercy of others on meeting with adverse medical conditions."
