

Medical Device Park to spur region's transformation

The Medical Device Park taking shape at Vikram Udyogpuri, located between Ujjain and Dewas, stands as the clearest indicator of the region's transformation. Spread across nearly 360 acres, this high-tech facility is set to become not only Madhya Pradesh's largest medical device park but also

a leading Med-Tech hub for the whole of western India in the coming years.

What makes this park particularly noteworthy is the direct collaboration of the country's premier technical and academic institutions, including IIT Indore, IIM Indore, RRCAT, SGSITS, and the Sri Aurobindo Medical College. This partnership will greatly benefit the industries establishing them-



selves here, while also opening new avenues for employment and skill development for thousands of young people across the Malwa region.

The agreement signed in June between the National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research, Ahmedabad (NIPER-A), and MPIDC brought national-level recognition to the project. NIPER-A is providing technical support in developing R&D laboratories, a common testing facility, and digital platforms within the park. With these tie-ups, the park is set to become even

more robust, offering research, testing, design, production, and clinical validation under one roof.

The incubation hub and skill-development centre to be set up within the park are poised to be game-changers for young talent. Training will be offered in advanced fields such as medical engineering, biotechnology, medical electronics, quality testing, and

regulatory affairs. This will enable local youth to access high-tech employment, launch start-ups, gain hands-on industry experience, and reduce the need to migrate to larger cities. For the first time, young people in the Ujjain region will find technology-driven career opportunities—previously available only in cities such as Bengaluru, Pune, and Hyderabad.
