Anirban Sengupta, a faculty member of Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Indore's Computer Science and Engineering department, has been conferred with the international prize - IEEE Chester Sall Memorial Consumer Electronics

Award 2020

Sengupta has become the second Indian to have received this coveted international honour. It is one of the highest and most prestigious research awards bestowed by the IEEE Society (United States of America) for innovative and outstanding contribution made in the field of Consumer Electronics.
Sengupta's research was based on securing chips used in smart devices such as camera, camcorder, smart watch, TV set-top box, medical imaging systems etc. His novel research work secures chips in electronic products used for producing images, signals and videos.

Good response prompts Vistara to start second

Chief Strategy Officer Vinod Kannan said that the airline soon would be starting off flights to other cities, optimistic on international flights if good

Vistara airlines has been getting good response just a few days of its launch. The response prompted the company to start its second flight to Delhi starting Tuesday.

The company plans to start more flights from Indore to other destinations across the city and would also introduce international flights if good response continues.

Vinod Kannan, Chief Strategy Officer of Vistara airlines—a joint venture between Tata and Singapore airlines informed the abovementioned upcoming strategies during the media interaction on Tuesday.

He said that Vistara Airlines is country's fastest growing airline and offers economy, business class and premium economy class.

It is also the first airline of the country that provides the facility of sanitary pads to the women passengers. The company started its services in 2015 and has grown up by almost 70% within the next four years.



Evening flight from New Delhi to connect Singapore

- Kannan said that the company has started its second flight from Indore to New Delhi. The flight would start at 6.30pm from New Delhi and would reach Indore at 7.55pm.
- The return journey of the flight would start from 8.30pm and would reach New Delhi at 10pm.
- The flight would be helpful for fliers who would reach the national capital by the morning and plan to return back to the capital in the evening.
- On the other hand Vistara has a flight facility to Singapore during the late night hours, which provides connectivity to Indoreans planning to

Right now it has 35 aeroplanes that connect 34 cities every day. 30 of these routes are domestic, while four are international.
