The courses for which the students have registered at IIT Indore are PhD in 11 disciplines, MTech + PhD dual degree in two disciplines, MSc + PhD dual degree in 5 disciplines, MTech in 6 disciplines, MS in 5 disciplines and MS (Research) in 3 disciplines.
