

IIT-I adds 54-apartment complex to its campus

Indore: Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Indore has added a 54-apartment's residential complex on its campus its faculty. The institute on its 12th Foundation Day inaugurated Kshipra residential complex consisting of 2 and 3 BHK residences for faculty and staff.

This residential complex is in addition to an already fully occupied 54 apartment residence building for faculty of the institute. With this 108 faculty of IIT, Indore will move inside the residential complex. The institute has 154 faculty members.

Professor Neelesh Kumar Jain, director (officiating), IIT, Indore said, "This will lead to the

shifting of the faculty members and staff inside the campus thus saving them the time and efforts for commuting. Besides a Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) plant with 2 water cooled centrifugal chillers each having 650 TR capacity have also been added for air conditioning at newly inaugurated facilities in the institute."

The institute has recently inaugurated an administration office 'Abhinandan Bhavan', Takshashila Lecture Hall Complex for conducting classes and a guest house Vindhyaachal.

Speaker at the Foundation Day celebration, Professor N. K. Ganguly, Padma Bhushan and former Director General, ICMR, delivered a talk on the current challenges in Covid19 vaccination and how we choose a vaccine.
