## Innovations needed in agri domain: IIT-K dir

IIT-Kharagpur director Prof. VK Tewari, on Wednesday, said that people are not getting attracted to the agriculture sector due to the shrinking of land tracts and innovations are needed in this area. He also highlighted the global view about the agricultural domain and mentioned the major reasons why people shy away from this sector.

Tewari was among the faculty members from different institutes who shared their views on the agriculture domain during the inauguration of a workshop on 'High-Performance Computing (HPC) in Agriculture Domain' inaugurated at IIT-Indore in virtual mode.

ing Mission (NSM) by IIT-Indore in association with ICAR-IISR, Indore; Mahindra University, Hyderabad; C-DAC, Pune; IISc, Bengaluru; and IIT-Kharagpur from July 14 to July 16," said Dr Aruna Tiwari, associate professor of IIT-Indore. IIT-Indore chairman Prof. DB Phatak was chief guest at the inaugural function.

Tewari; IIT-Indore director Prof. NK Jain; IIT-Bhilai director Prof. Rajat Moona; and Prof. Srikanth Sastry of the Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research, Bengaluru, working in the areas of HPC, Agriculture, and genomics were the main speakers at the workshop.
