He said Indo-French academic collaboration started with the introduction of French language classes by the Alliance Française for IIT-I students. He hinted at academic collaborations with French universities.

At present, IIT-I has inked a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Saarland University, Saarbrucken, Germany in November and this partnership allows for student and faculty exchanges. The institute is exploring other possibilities for such partnerships.

As part of the 'France Day', students were engaged in various activities related to French culture. The highlight of the day was a contest general knowledge contest on France.

However, to attract more participants, the contest was held in English. The students presented skits and mono-act plays in French and displayed posters. A few French movies were also shown.
