for young entrepreneurs and guide them in their ventures.



Smart Sugarcane Planter: Three students from Faculty of Management Studies, New Delhi, came up with an automated machine

to plant sugarcane. The machine has censors which test the soil quality and plants the sugarcane with such precision that it reduces fertilizer cost by 66%. It also ensures that there is enough distance between two plants in order to attain higher yield. The use of this machine saves a farmer Rs40,000 per hectare


