Indian Institute of Technology Indore has made it mandatory for all graduating students to attend the first convocation ceremony of the institute on June 8.

In a notice, the institute has said the graduating students would have to give consent to participate in the ceremony one month in advance.

"All students declared

pass would have to compulsorily attend the ceremony. However, this may be relaxed on exceptional circumstances with prior permission of the competent authority. Such students must submit application to academic office stating reasons for not attending the ceremony, by May 3, positively. If allowed, they will be conferred with the degree in absentia," the notice read.

The institute has also

made it mandatory for the students to participate in dress rehearsal to he held ahead of the ceremony.

As President Pranab Mukherjee would be chief guest of the function, the institute has issued strict guidelines for guests of the students.

The guests would have to carry their identity proof with them. They were also told not be bring their children below the age of eight to the function.
